### **An Update from Meg Rowe and the House of Delegates**

#### **How many delegates does Pennsylvania have? Is this likely to change?**

Pennsylvania currently has three elected and active delegates to represent our PAND members in the Academy of House of Delegates. Yes., the number of delegates each state is allowed is determined by the Academy membership from the state. Each state is permitted 1 delegate for 1200 members. That number increases for each additional 1200 members and is re-evaluated every 3 years. For the 2017-2020 time period, Pennsylvania was allowed 3 delegates because our membership in the Academy was well in excess of 3600 members. PAND was notified that as of June 1, 2020 through May 31, 2023 we will be allowed only 2 active delegates because our membership was less than 3600.

#### **Does that mean Pennsylvania will only have 2 delegates for the next 3 years?**

Yes and No. Pennsylvania will be allowed 2 active (voting) delegates but has the option to elect a “delegate-elect” which is a non-voting position. Our present by-laws do not contain the “delegate elect” position. Thus, this position and funding for it will be presented to the PAND Board of Directors for approval at the March, 2020 Board of Directors meeting. If approved, a special election will be held for the “delegate-elect” position.

#### **Do the delegates represent the entire state or just certain districts?**

The delegates represent the entire state at the House of Delegates meetings. As Pennsylvania is a large state, the delegates usually divide the state by districts to make communications and attending district Board and other meeting manageable. Presently, one delegate works with Pittsburgh and Northwest, one works with Central and Northeast, and one works with Philadelphia and Lehigh Valley.

#### **What do the delegates do?**

The responsibilities of the delegates are:

- To enable bidirectional communication between the House of Delegates and the members in Pennsylvania
- To attend district Board and membership meetings
- To write monthly PAND and district (as requested) newsletters
- To solicit comments regarding Academy House of Delegates activities through attendance at state and district meetings, survey monkeys, and other means as necessary
- To assist members with questions they may have and direct members to Academy units for in depth information and guidance
- To attend the meetings of the Academy House of Delegates, Pennsylvania Annual Meeting and Exhibition, at least one district meeting each year.
- To vote on motions presented at the HOD meetings.
- The delegate-elect has all of the responsibilities of the active delegates except voting.
- The delegate-elect is a non-voting member
- To encourage members’ suggestions for future professional/strategic issues for the Academy’s consideration

#### **How many meetings does the Academy House of Delegates hold?**

The HOD presently holds 3 meetings per year. One is in person and the others are virtual. The in person meeting is held before FNCE in the city where FNCE is held. The virtual meetings are held in January and March/April.

#### **Do delegates have to pay their expenses for the in person meeting? Are expenses also reimbursed for the “delegate-elect”? Do the delegates get complimentary registration to FNCE?**

The Academy pays for the transportation to and from the in person meeting for the active delegates. This includes land, air, rail, etc., a baggage allowance, airport parking, and transport to and from the airport if needed. PAND pays for hotel costs and per diem for the active delegates. Hotel is reimbursed at the rate of ½ of the total cost of a room (If a nightly room total cost is \$300.00, PAND reimburses \$150.00). If a delegate shares a room with another person, the delegate’s cost is zero. If a delegate prefers a private room, the cost would be \$300.00 and \$150.00 is reimbursed. If approved by the PAND Board, PAND will reimburse all expenses (as listed above) for the delegate-elect. The Academy and PAND do not pay for FNCE registration.

#### **What are the benefits of being a delegate?**

Some of the benefits of being a delegate are the opportunities to meet and work with other delegates from across the country and internationally and to help shape the governance of our profession. You have access to Academy information and developments in advance of the membership. As the delegate position can be a stepping stone to other Academy elected and appointed positions, delegates have great opportunities to grow personally and professionally.
